

STUDENT DRESS CODE & UNIFORM POLICY

The Clontarf Beach State High School uniform policy consists of a formal uniform, and/or sport uniform that students are required to adhere to when:

- Attending or representing the school.
- Travelling to and from school.
- Engaged in any school-based activities outside of normal school hours.

The uniform provides clothing that aims to contribute to a safe teaching & learning environment by:

- Allowing ready identification of students and non-students.
- Fostering a sense of belonging.
- Enhancing mutual respect by minimising evidence of social difference.

The school's uniform policy reflects school and community standards whilst catering for health and safety standards, particularly with regard to footwear.

Years 7 to 9 are to wear sports uniform every day.

Years 10 to 12 are to wear formal uniform every Tuesday.

Formal Uniform (Must be worn by Years 10 to 12 on Tuesday)

Option 1 - Formal Uniform for Years 10, 11 & 12 (Compulsory on Tuesday)

Grey tab walk shorts. Green shirt with senior tie for Year 12. Long grey socks with gold and green stripes.	Hat: cap or bucket hat. Winter addition: Fleece or tracksuit jacket with school logo. Grey jumper with school logo, black trousers.
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Option 2 - Formal Uniform for Years 10, 11 & 12 (Compulsory on Tuesday)

Regulation style green skirt. Green & white striped blouse with senior tie for Year 12 or Junior Secondary criss-cross tie. White socks. Hat: cap or bucket hat.	Opaque black tights are permitted during terms 2 & 3. Winter addition: Fleece or tracksuit jacket with school logo. Grey jumper with school logo.
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- Black leather/vinyl lace up school shoes that can be polished. These will ensure compliance with work place health and safety requirements. Boots, buckle-over, ballet style, hi-tops, canvas or suede shoes are not permitted.
- Trousers are to be in the style of full-length DRESS PANTS - no jeans, leggings, track pants, activewear, tights or cargo pants are to be worn.

Sports Uniform

- Green sports shorts with school logo.
- Gold, green, blue sports top with school logo.
- White visible sports socks.
- Sports shoes must be mainly white or black lace up with non-marking soles. Canvas shoes, skate shoes and hi-tops are not permitted.
- School trackpants and fleece or tracksuit jacket with school logo. Grey jumper with school logo.

Sports Uniform

- Clontarf Beach State High School recognises the risks of sun exposure and is committed to educating its school community to adopt life-long sun-safe attitudes.
- All students are required to wear a hat. The hat has been chosen by the P&C with student input and can be purchased at the school's uniform shop. The hat is compulsory for all activities conducted in the sun, including excursions, outdoor activities, HPE and sport (where possible). It is strongly encouraged that students wear a hat during lunch breaks if in the sun.



The following expectations are held with regard to how the uniform is worn:

- No part of the Clontarf Beach State High School uniform is to be worn with casual clothes at any time.
- Students are expected to be neat and tidy in their appearance as befits a place of learning and work. It is necessary that hairstyles are neat and conservative. Unnatural hair colours are not acceptable. No visible makeup.
- The only jewelry items permitted are a wristwatch, small flat ring, small plain silver or gold sleepers or studs, wristwatch. One facial piercing is permitted but it must have a clear plastic head/cap or very small stud. Necklaces should not be visible at any time. Two ear piercings are permitted fitted with a small silver or gold sleeper or stud. Large holes in the earlobe must have a solid neutral-coloured earring.
- Fingernails are to be naturally coloured and short in length, as to not present a Workplace Health & Safety hazard.
- Clothing requirements for school excursions will be determined according to the type of trip. Parents and Carers will be advised in the permission letter sent home. Students not complying with these requirements will not be able to attend the excursion.
- If any part of the uniform cannot be worn at any time a note of explanation from a Parent or Caregiver should be sent to the care class teacher. In all, but exceptional circumstances, a short-term loan of correct uniform items will be arranged for students out of uniform. Students out of uniform without a note of explanation will be subject to disciplinary action determined by the school.
- In very cold weather students are encouraged to wear thermals, skivvies, tights, undershirts etc. however they must not be able to be seen.

Students are not permitted to wear:

- Grossly oversized or undersized uniforms.
- Contrasting undergarments which are visible (white or light grey short sleeve t-shirts are acceptable).
- Any visible item not specified in this document.
- Beanies are not permitted.
